<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Mental Health Advocate</u></p> <p>Location: Patchogue Hours: 15 hrs. per week, Monday Through Friday</p> <p>Job Function: Responsible for representing Federation with interfacing agencies at meetings and events and advocate for the needs of people in recovery from mental illness within the mental health system. Provide peer support, advocacy, education and information to staff, volunteers and program members. Facilitate peer support groups at designated hospitals.</p> <p>Qualifications: Must identify as a person in recovery from a mental illness and willing to self-disclose their mental health journey in order to provide a message of hope and recovery. High School Diploma or equivalent. Peer Certification preferred. Clean, valid N.Y. State driver's license. Fingerprinting, criminal record check and all necessary clearances from the Justice Center.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Assistant Case Manager</u></p> <p>Location: Suffolk County, various locations Hours: 19 hrs. per week, Monday Through Friday</p> <p>Job Function: Assist Case Managers by providing selected services to client. Accompany and/ or transport clients to various appointments. Demonstrate knowledge of benefits and how to access them such as SSI/SSD, and DSS. Teach clients ADL skills as well as use of public transportation, shopping and budgeting. Conduct occasional home or hospital visits. Model a behavior that empowers and shows a positive mental health recovery.</p> <p>Qualifications: High School Diploma or Equivalent, NYS Driver's license. Registered, inspected, and insured vehicle, and personal experience with mental health system. Fingerprinting, criminal record check, approval from NYS Office of Mental Health.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Peer Support -HCBS</u></p> <p>Locations: Suffolk County, Nassau County and New York City various locations Hours: Part Time Job Function: Provide Home Community Based Services (HCBS) to Medicaid beneficiaries with mental illness and/or substance use disorders to receive services in their own home or community. These services include peer support, habilitation, and psychosocial rehabilitation and employment services. Services are provided in the community and support the individual goals and recovery for living, employment, and social skills that promote hope and encouragement to individuals. Link and accompany individuals to needed social services and community.</p> <p>Qualifications: Peer Certification, with experience serving people with mental illness, developmental disabilities or alcoholism or substance use. Clean, valid NYS Driver's License. fingerprinting, criminal record check, approval from NYS Office of Mental Health.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Peer Counselor – Community Residence</u></p> <p>Location: Nassau & Suffolk. Glen Cove, Sunken Meadow Hours: Part Time & Full Time Available</p> <p>Job Function: To provide a positive role model of community functioning, informal counseling, peer support and ADL training in a licensed residential program providing transitional housing to people with psychiatric disabilities.</p> <p>Qualification: Personal or shared experience with mental illness and/or substance abuse issues. Ability and desire to assist others in mastery of independent living skills and the personal recovery process. Understanding of peer support, self-help philosophy. Clean, valid NY State Driver's License. Fingerprinting, criminal record check, approval from NY State Office of Mental Health.</p>

Location : Copiague
Hours: Part Time (10 hours)

Job Function:
 Provide direct services and become a natural support expert for clients to support their recovery goals on a multi-disciplinary treatment team for individuals with substance use disorder diagnoses.

Qualifications:
 Lived experience relevant to client population. Must have CRPA or CRPA-P. Minimum 1 year experience in rehabilitation setting. A valid and clean NY State driver’s license. Fingerprinting, criminal record check, and approval from NYS Office of Alcohol and Substance Abuse Services.

 Scattered Site Supportive Housing**

Location: Queens, Brooklyn, Bronx
Hours: Full time or Part time

Job Function:
 To provide positive role model of community functioning, informal counseling and peer supports to others with psychiatric disabilities living in Scattered Site

Qualifications:
 Personal or shared experience with mental health and/or substance abuse issues. Ability and desire to assist others in mastery of independent living skills. Understanding of peer support self-help philosophy. Clean, valid driver’s license, Fingerprinting, Criminal record check, Approval from NYS Office of Mental Health.

Family Peer Advocate

LOCATION: Remote (Staff are expected to report to West Babylon for meetings & supervisions)
HOURS: Full Time 35 hours

QUALIFICATIONS:
 Minimum High School Diploma, Family Peer Certification, experience serving children and families with serious mental illness. The Family Peer Advocates must meet qualifications as per New York State requirements. Clean, valid NYS Driver’s License preferred. Fingerprinting, criminal record check, approval from NYS Office of Mental Health.

JOB FUNCTION:
 Oversees and coordinates access to all services (behavioral, medical health and social service supports) to assist children and families to stay healthy in Nassau County Only. Family Peer Advocate (FPA) and the parent/family member/caregiver form collaboration for the benefit of the child/youth. The FPA will hold a caseload of 36 children/families. Service components include activities to help the families to develop resources and supports for the benefit of the child/youth, including engagement, bridging and transition, self-advocacy, self-efficacy and empowerment, parent skill development, and community connections.. Provide in-home services to children, adults, and families with serious mental illness to receive services in their own home or community. Help members prevent and manage chronic health conditions and recovery from serious mental illness. Provide services that support the acquisition for living, employment, and social skills and be offered in home and community based setting that promote hope and encourage to individuals. Link and accompany individuals to needed social services and community resources as necessary to facilitate their recovery goals.

Youth Peer Advocate

LOCATION: Remote (Staff are expected to report to West Babylon for meetings & supervisions)
HOURS: Full Time 35 hours

QUALIFICATIONS:
 Minimum High School Diploma, Youth Peer Certification, experience serving children and families with serious mental illness. Youth Peer Advocates (YPA) are individuals between 18-30 years of age who self-identify as a person with first-hand experience with a social, emotional, medical, developmental, substance use, and/or behavioral challenges as a young person or have received services in any one of the child-serving systems (juvenile justice, foster care, special education, or addiction recovery). The Youth Peer Advocate must meet qualifications as per New York State requirements. Clean, valid NYS Driver’s License preferred. Fingerprinting, criminal record check, approval from NYS Office of Mental Health.

JOB FUNCTION:
 YPAs use their lived experience to promote resiliency, recovery, wellness, and self-efficacy in young people and promote the practice of youth-guided and family-driven approaches. The YPA will hold a caseload of 36 children/families.
