What is the time commitment of the program?

1. 16-week classroom training (approximately 320 hours)
2. 12-week internship (24 hours per week)
3. Employment search and support

Do I qualify for HTH?

Applicants must:

- Have a clinical mental health diagnosis
- Reside in the NYC metropolitan area
- Have at least a high school diploma (or the equivalent)
- Be able to work in the U.S.

Why Howie the Harp?
