This webinar will introduce participants to the **Self-Assessment for Modification of Anti-Racism Tool (SMART)**, an innovative self-directed quality improvement tool developed by the [American Association for Community Psychiatry \(AACCP\)](#) to assist community mental health organizations in addressing structural racism. The presenters will describe the process by which SMART was developed, including its grounding in input from community mental health providers and existing health inequity frameworks. The domains and items of SMART as well as its application process will be outlined. Presenters will also provide lessons from on-the-ground applications of SMART in diverse community mental health settings.
